Today’s Gospel Reading: Luke 15:1-10

Time to Reflect

Do you remember misplacing or losing something precious to you? How hard or urgently did you search for it? Did you eventually find it? How good did that feel? In these two stories Jesus responds to the religious folk who resented his companionship with “unsuitable” people - the “undesirables”. Jesus reminds them that God may be happy with the 99 faithful sheep, but is not satisfied until the search has found the one outstanding lost one. The woman (standing in for God NB) can’t settle with the safe 9 coins until she restores to their company the lost one.

Of course people are not coins nor sheep - we have our stubborn ways, our pride, our resistance to God’s goodness. But God is always looking for “the lost” whether it be those who have never known God’s love, those who have drifted away from God’s grace or those who just feel “lost” in life. And (spoiler alert for next week’s reading of the lost son) God always welcomes us back with open arms.

Take a moment to hold before God anyone you know who you sense is “lost” - whatever that means for them/you.

Take a time to sit quietly

Luke 15:1-10

Now all the tax-collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to him. 2 And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, ‘This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them.’

3 So he told them this parable: 4 ‘Which one of you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the one that is lost until he finds it? 5 When he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders and rejoices. 6 And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and neighbours, saying to them, “Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost.” 7 Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who need no repentance.

8 ‘Or what woman having ten silver coins, [a] if she loses one of them, does not light a lamp, sweep the house, and search carefully until she finds it? 9 When she has found it, she calls together her friends and neighbours, saying, “Rejoice with me, for I have found the coin that I had lost.” 10 Just so, I tell you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents.’
